## International Veterinary Vaccinology Network (IVVN)

- Launched in August 2017 after receiving £2.2 million from the MRC/BBRSC/GCRF
- The IVVN will facilitate the formation of international collaborations to improve vaccine design and development for livestock and zoonotic diseases in low-and-middle income countries (LMICs).
- We will bring together individuals from across the fields of veterinary and human vaccinology, irrespective of pathogen or species of interest, with the aim of addressing key bottlenecks that are preventing vaccine development for important pathogens of livestock in LMICs.





## **IVVN Catalyst Funding: Pump-priming grants**

The IVVN will fund pump-priming grants (up to £100,000 per project) that aim to address a key bottleneck preventing the development of veterinary vaccines.
